The world may offer us comfort but we were made for GREATNESS!






Psi Lambda Chapter of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc. was chartered January 20, 2005 in New York City. The Chartering Ceremony was held on March 19, 2005 at the historic St. James Presbyterian Church in Harlem, NY. Psi Lambda Lambda was chartered by thirty-seven Omega Men, of which nineteen have life membership.

As its inaugural venture, the Chapter sponsored a theater party. We participated in the Mentoring Program of the Eagle Academy. We also served as volunteers at the Supplementary Education Expo. The Chapter sponsored fundraisers that support our Scholarship Fund. We conducted a shoe drive for the Etu Evans Solesville Foundation, Inc. to benefit survivors of Katrina – a monetary donation was given to assist in the transportation of items collected. Since then, our Chapter established the Purple Book Gold Book Project to create functional bookshelf space in New York hospitals for pediatric patients, and their families with educational and fun reading materials. In 2007, the Family Health Symposium and Backpack Jam was founded to provide education and health screenings to raise awareness of health disparities and importance of health and wellness, along distribution of free backpack with school supplies. In 2008, the Purple and Gold Leadership Academy for Young Men was founded to provide an educational, mentoring and supportive atmosphere for young men between the ages of 14-18 years old. The Chapter created The Omega Trailblazers Foundation, 501©3 non-profit tax-exempt partnership to support our mentoring, education, and social action programs to elevate our community both socially and economically. The Chapter is committed to the four Cardinal Principles of the Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc.: MANHOOD, SCHOLARSHIP, PERSEVERANCE, and UPLIFT. We are:

A native of Shelbyville, Kentucky, with a B.S. Degree from Kentucky State University and a Master's Degree in Counseling from Indiana University. Butler Dowery is a retired Guidance Counselor for the New York City Department of Education and is also a retired Adjunct Professor from the Borough of Manhattan Community College (CUNY) where he served as a Guidance Counselor.

Bro. Dowery is a Life Member #81, of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc. He was instrumental in the reactivation of Epsilon and Xi Phi Chapters in New York and in 2005, became the charter basileus of Psi Lambda Lambda Chapter in New York City. During his tenure as basileus of Psi Lambda Lambda, the chapter contributed to the victims of Hurricane Katrina and John Edward Bruce Development and Educational Center in Brooklyn, New York. He served as Basileus of Xi Phi Chapter for five (5) years and received the honor of Basileus Emeritus for both Epsilon and Xi Phi Chapters. He served as Chairman of the Constitution and Bylaws Committee and the Reclamation and Retention Committee of Xi Phi Chapter, which won several awards on the district level. In 1992, he was crowned King Que at Xi Phi Chapter's Mardi Gras for raising more than \$2,800. In 2013, the NPHC - NYC Fraternity of the Year Award was renamed the Butler B. Dowery of the Year Award. The year 2022 marked the 70th anniversary of Butler B. Dowery's initiation as a member of the Omega Psi Fraternity, Inc.

Bro. Dowery is one of the Past Tri-Chairpersons of the Metropolitan Omega Chapters Carter G. Woodson Celebration and Omega's Founders Day. Finally, Bro. Dowery has attended all but two conclaves since 1959.

Bro. Dowery is an elder at the St. James Presbyterian Church in Harlem, New York. He serves as the President of Kentucky State University's Alumni Association; New York Chapter. He is a member of the Executive Board of KSU Alumni Association; member of the KSU Alumni Hall of Fame; member of Whitney M. Young National Project; Alumni Chapter representative for college fairs and member of the Board of Directors for the National Organization of Black College Alumni, Inc., New York Chapter. Upon his nomination by Kentucky State University, he received the National Association for Equal Opportunity in Higher Education (NAFEO) Distinguished Alumni Award at the National Conference on Blacks in Higher Education in Washington, D.C.

Bro. Dowery continues to share his wisdom and guidance (garnered over many years) with Psi Lambda Lambda Chapter and our beloved fraternity, Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc.

ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS & CLOSING REMARKS





Born in Brooklyn, New York, Valerie Hollingsworth Baker served as the 25th International Centennial Grand Basileus of Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Incorporated from July 2018 – July 2022 (Two Terms). Prior to being elected to Grand Basileus, Valerie held numerous elected and appointed positions in her home chapter Delta Mu Zeta, served-as Atlantic Regional Director for four years, served as Chairman of the National Executive Board for two terms (four years) and as the International First Vice President for two terms (four years), overseeing the entire sorority's membership functions (intake, reclamation, retention, chapter chartering and reactivation).

As the International Centennial President, Valerie and the Centennial Chair were responsible for the organization's week-long historic


Centennial celebration, which took place January 12-18, 2020. She also instituted a \$100,000 scholarship, which was awarded to a female high school graduate who is pursuing her bachelor's degree at Stanford University. The first was awarded in June of 2020. She then increased the next two scholarships at \$125,000 each which were presented in November 2021 and July 2022. The scholarship is named after Arizona Cleaver Stemons, Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Incorporated Founder Emeritus and is the first scholarship of its kind to be provided by a "Divine Nine" organization to a single student. Valerie also has assembled a list of accomplishments, including:

- Global expansion with chapter charters in the British Virgin Islands, Ghana, West Africa and reinstated the chapter in Liberia which was dormant for over fifty years.
- Purchased the sorority's second property (a historical building located in Logan's Circle) in Washington, D.C. in March of 2019 and paid off the mortgage in November of 2020.

Scholarship is a principle that Valerie holds in high regard, having graduated from York Institute as the class valedictorian at the age of fourteen (14) and accepted into ten (10) of the nation's top universities. At the age of eighteen (18), she received a Bachelor of Arts degree from Fordham University, where she majored in Industrial Organizational Psychology with a minor in Theater and Drama. Valerie also received a Paralegal degree from the American Institute for Paralegal Studies. In May 2023 she was conferred with a Honorary Doctorate of Ministry from Carolina Christian College. Since August 2023, Valerie holds the position of Chairman of the Zeta National Educational Foundation as of August 2023.

Valerie is a member of the NAACP and the National Council of Negro Women. Valerie also volunteers her time with the American Red Cross, UNCF, and New York Cares. In addition, she served on the board of directors for the Bedford-Stuyvesant Mental Health Clinic.







André V. Branch is Senior Vice President and General Manager for M·A·C Cosmetics, North America at The Estée Lauder Companies. He is responsible for leading and accelerating the brand's North America go-to-market strategy, maximizing growth potential, capturing new business opportunities, and driving differentiated, best-in-class experiences for all in-store and online channels. He is a member of the company's North America Leadership Team, M·A·C Global Leadership Team and North America Region Inclusion, Diversity and Equity Taskforce. Doris R. Conner is a legend!

Doris R. Conner served as the 30th President of Tau Omega Chapter, Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated®. She was initiated into Lambda Chapter in 1961 and is a Life Member and a Golden Member (50+ years). Prior to her term as President, she served as Hodegos (Hostess), Philacter, Second Vice President, Graduate Advisor, and First Vice President as well as Chairman of many committees. She is currently the Chapter's Historian. She is co-author of the chapter history book published in 2014: The Legacy of the Pacesetters of Tau Omega Chapter, Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated®, A History of Timeless Service to the Harlem Community and Beyond. In 2022, the inaugural Doris R. Conner Leadership Bootcamp was established by Tau Omega Chapter. Doris has co-chaired or served on six North Atlantic Regional Committees, including the History and Rules committees.

Doris R. Conner is a retired Pediatric Nurse Practitioner and Coordinator of Central Harlem School Health Program of Harlem Hospital Center/Columbia University. She received her B.S. in Nursing from Hunter College of the City University of New York, M.A. in Maternal and Child Health and Supervision from Teachers College, Columbia University, and her Pediatric Nurse Practitioner Certificate from The Presbyterian Hospital, Columbia Presbyterian Medical Center. Doris is the co-author of seven professional publications, including School Based Clinics in Central Harlem, Caring for Children on The Frontlines.

Doris R. Conner's community service includes being an active member of Convent Avenue Baptist Church. She is currently the Coordinator of the Senior Citizens Advocacy and Monitoring Program (SCAMP) for members 80 years and older. She is a member of the church's Columbia University In Touch program for health screenings and health education. She is currently on the Board of Directors of Harlem Hospital Center Auxiliary, First Vice President (and as Chairman of Archives and History Committee compiled and produced the book, Recalling 95 Years of Service, 1911-2006, Harlem Hospital Center Auxiliary, Incorporated), Central Harlem Senior Citizens Centers, Incorporated (Former President), The Tau Omega Charitable Trust Fund, Incorporated, President 2006-2014, Incorporator and currently Parliamentarian. She is a Lifetime Member of the N.A.A.C.P.



Honoree Freida D. Foster

For over 20 years, Ms. Freida D. Foster has served as a public officer, appointed by various Mayors and Governors over the years. First appointed by the Governor in 2009 and re-appointed by Governor Hochul in 2022, Ms. Foster currently serves as Vice Chair for the NYS Worker's Compensation Board where she adjudicates and processes hundreds of claims for employees who report injuries and seek supplemental benefits while they recover from various ailments. She also assists in the overall oversight of the Board's management.

In June 2006, Ms. Foster was appointed to the Board of Trustees with the City University of New York (CUNY); one of the largest public university systems in the country where she served for 10 years. Here, Freida assisted with the governance of the 24 campuses with over 530,000 students, that comprise the CUNY system.
